The tour will visit Elementos' Oropesa Tin **<u>Project'</u>** and the historically significant 'Rio Tinto Copper Mine' operated by Atalaya Mining. The Oropesa portion of the tour will focus on what it takes to develop a responsible and modern tin mine within the European Union, we will walk the site and take you through the steps of turning drill holes in the ground through to planning a modern hard-rock tin mine, primed for development. The Rio Tinto portion of the tour will involve a visit to one of the oldest mines in the world (first mined ~3,000 BC), including driving into an active open pit and processing facility. As we travel, we will ensure you take in some historical sites of regional Andalucia and enjoy some classic Andalusian (Spanish) food.

Royal Alcázar – Visit Website
